Stay Safe on the Water!

Are you thinking about getting out on the lake or exploring the bay by boat soon? If so, we hope you have fun but also stay safe. Before you pull away from the dock, learn your state's boating safety requirements and take a moment to review the quick tips below.

 STAY DILIGENT When you bring your boat out of storage, check for any damage that should be repaired. Have between planting and harvesting. It is celebrated in many cultures on the night of June 23rd, as <u>Midsummer Eve.</u>

• June 28th is the anniversary of the 1969 Stonewall Riots
— a watershed moment for LGBT rights in the United States. To honor this event, June is designated as Pride Month.

June's birthstone is the **Pearl** and the birth flowers are the **Rose** and **Honeysuckle**.

A rose in general indicates love or desire. Specific roses may relay other messages. For example, a white rose may mean "silence" or "new beginnings," while a yellow rose signifies "friendship" or "joy."



Grilled Chicken Ranch Burgers

<u>Ingredients</u>:

- 3/4 cup ranch salad dressing
- 3/4 cup panko bread crumbs
- 3/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 3 teaspoons pepper
- 4 pounds ground chicken

- a qualified marine mechanic check the engine, lights, and other equipment before using the boat.
- STAY INFORMED Take a boater safety course, especially if you are new to boating. Always check the weather before your excursion and heed small craft advisories.
- STAY CONNECTED Let friends and family know where you will be and have a fully charged cell phone or marine radio available.
- STAY AWARE Weather can change quickly. If you notice a sudden drop in temperature, change in wind, or darkening clouds, err on the side of getting to shore and off open water.
- STAY AFLOAT Make sure everyone is wearing a Coast Guard approved life jacket that fits properly. Check that your boat has all of the necessary safety equipment before you head out, including fire extinguishers, flares, and first aid kits.
- STAY ALERT Never operate a boat under the influence of alcohol or drugs. When waterskiing or tubing, two or more people are required to be in the boat at all times.

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 16 hamburger buns, split
- Optional toppings: Tomato slices, lettuce leaves, sliced red onion, sliced cucumber, sliced avocado and ranch dip

Directions:

- 1. In a large bowl, mix the first 6 ingredients. Add chicken; mix lightly but thoroughly. Shape mixture into sixteen 1/2-in.-thick patties. Brush both sides with oil; refrigerate, covered, 15 minutes to allow patties to firm up.
- 2. Grill burgers, covered, over medium heat or broil 3-4 inches from heat 5-6 minutes on each side or until a thermometer reads 165°. Serve on buns with toppings as desired.
